Watch and sing along to the song: Father Abraham Had Many Sons

Here is a short story you can watch with your child: <u>Two Sons and a Father</u>

Who knows what day it is today? That's right, it's Father's Day! You may have gone shopping for a gift for your Dad or perhaps made him something. One of the reasons why this day is special is also because we can remember God, our Heavenly Father this day. Even if you don't have an earthly Dad or don't see him often, you have God, our heavenly father who loves and cares for you, just like the father of the prodigal son.

Gifts are fun to give an earthly Dad but God doesn't need us to give Him physical gifts. All He would ask for is written here in the Bible:

'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind'; and, 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' (Luke 10:27)

Additional activities

1. Keepsake Handprint Craft: You'll need: washable paints, large paintbrushes, baby wipes, construction paper, markers. Use brushes to paint the palms of little ones' hands. Guide their hands to leave an imprint on the paper that forms a heart (see picture below). Make their thumbs touch to shape the top of the heart and their pointer fingers touch to shape the bottom of the heart. When the paint dries, write at the top of the page, "Daddy, thank you for giving me your heart!" Happy Father's Day!"
